THE COMMUNIST THREAT TO PEACE

Erroneous doctrines often lead the believers in those doctrines to destructive conduct. Many communist doctrines are demonstrably false, but the communists believe them. The leaders of the Soviet Union are such believers. Consequently they have devised programs which threaten the peace of the world.

In preparation for the 26th Congress of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union, which commenced in Moscow on February 23, a number of documents were prepared which outlined certain basic communist doctrines and the derived principles that guide Soviet policies. These documents were published in the magazine, International Affairs A Monthly Journal of Political Analysis which is published in Moscow, in English, and which is distributed widely throughout the U. S. A., England, Australia, and English?speaking countries generally. Two articles, "The Social Foundations of the Soviet Peace Policy, November, 1980, page 67, and, "Anti?Communism??The Core of Imperialist Foreign Policy," December, 1980, page 68, merit close attention.

In accordance with their frequently?stated conviction that, "Peaceful Coexistence does not extend to the sphere of Ideology," the communists have no hesitation in making ferocious attacks upon Capitalism and the U.S.A. They repeat the charge that Capitalism causes war and that the U.S.A. is imperialistic. Note these statements:

Capitalism Causes War

"The exploitation of man by man that is characterisitic of the capitalist system has always bred wars between states and nations so that some of them could exploit others." (Page 61)

"The interests of the capitalist class and the imperialist and monopolistic circles which, because of their social nature, cannot exist in any other way than by exploiting the working classes in their countries, prompt the imperialist powers to transplant relations of exploitation, among the peoples of other countries and to pursue foreign policies aimed at enslaving other nations by any means, including armed force." (Page 61)

The U.S.A is Imperialistic

"Imperialism has not lost its aggressive character nowadays, and continues to pursue expansionistic and hegemonistic objectives in the international arena, although its opportunities for attaining these objectives have largely been restricted. This is well exemplified by the current policy of the US which claims almost the whole of the world as a sphere of its 'vital interests' demanding control over sources of raw materials all over the world and dispatching troops to all parts of the globe in a bid to uphold these 'interests'." (Page 62)

PEACE Equals the Rule of Communism Over all the World

To emphasize their doctrine that defines "peace" as the condition that will prevail once the entire world is ruled by communists, the writers take us right back to Karl Marx:

"A new society is springing up, whose international rule will be Peace because its national ruler will be everywhere the same???'Labor'. (Page 62)

The communists cling to the delusion that the Communist Party is the Party of Labor; that it is the brain of the industrial proletariat; that the "Dictatorship of the Proletariat" is government by the laboring masses. This delusion has become more difficult to sustain since the workers, the industrial proletariat, of Poland have massively repudiated the Communist Party and its institutions as their representatives and have demanded and received the right to form their

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own unions. It remains to be seen how long they will retain this right.

Privileges for Communists

The report reaffirms the blatant falsehood that there are no privileged classes in the Soviet Union:

"As distinct from the capitalist countries, the Soviet Union does not have privileged military, bureaucratic, academic and other caste?like communities, which are virtually maintained by monopoly capital and which for this reason uphold the interests of their masters and, fulfilling their 'social contact', pursue an expansionist, predatory course in international affairs." (Page 63)

It is notorious that communist bureaucrats and the elite in the military, educational and artistic realms enjoy such privileges as: 1) Much higher wages; 2) The right to buy food, clothing, and other goods in special stores where the merchandise is superior and the prices inferior; 3) Chauffeur?driven limousines; 4) Special apartments in selected buildings; 5) Access to superior vacation facilities; 6) Country cottages or dachas; and, 71 Admission for their children into special schools.

The New Man

The justification for communist dictatorship is that it is necessary in order to create the conditions that will change human nature, eliminate the selfishness and greed which capitalism has generated and create a regenerate man who will possess a superb mind, a magnificent body and a character dedicated to selfless service. The writer claims that such a man has already been created in the Soviet Union:

"The entire country has changed dramatically and a new man, the man of socialist society, has been moulded. The Soviet people have risen from poverty, hunger, backwardness and illiteracy to the heights of civilization, science and culture." (Page 65)

Force is Justified to Retain Communist Rule

The inner imperative that compels the communist rulers of the Soviet Union to use military force to retain communist rule in any country once it has been imposed there is explained in these statements:

"The profound internationalism that is characteristic of the Soviet people stems from the very nature of the working class, which is the leading force of our society. The working class everywhere, regardless of national affiliation has a vital interest in peace and a better life, in stamping out capitalist exploitation where ever it exists and in giving a rebuff to the imperialist expansion... In assisting their brethren in the other countries in the struggle for social and national liberation the working people in any country are thus upholding their own right to freedom and a better future.

"This is why the Soviet people cannot remain indifferent when imperialism encroaches on the freedom or revolutionary gains of the peoples of Cuba, Vietnam, Angola, Afghanistan and other countries. The attempts of imperialist reactionary forces to suppress the freedom of the peoples and to check the revolutionary process are regarded by the Soviet people as an immediate threat to their own country and as a potential menace to the freedom and revolutionary achievements of the USSR. By protecting other peoples against imperialist aggression, the Soviet people are protecting themselves." (Page 66)

There we have it. The invasion of Afghanistan is legitimate defense for the Soviet Union. A similar justification will be made for the invasion of Poland if it comes to pass. Belief in communist doctrine leads the Soviet leaders to interpret any spontaneous attempt by the people to overthrow communism as "attempts of imperialist reactionary forces to suppress the freedom of the peoples and to check the revolutionary process.

The Brezhnev Doctrine, which states that it is the duty of the Soviet Union to use military force to prevent the people of any country from exercising their right to self?determination by overthrowing their communist dictators, is simply a logical development from the communist doctrine of Proletarian Internationalism. Force must be used even if it threatens a major war.

This same responsibility is stressed in the article "Anti?Communism??the Core of Imperialist Foreign Policy." (December, 1980)

"The Soviet people manifest their solidarity with the other nations' struggle for freedom and progress, and they consider rendering assistance to the liberation movements as the internationalist duty of all democratic and revolutionary forces. Leonid Brezhnev noted: 'We oppose export of revolution. At the same time, the Communist Party of the Soviet Union, our government and the entire Soviet people openly and unequivocally express their solidarity with the liberation and anti?imperialist movements'." (Page 74)

With such convictions, it is certain that the Soviet Union is doing whatever it can to help the Revolutionary Forces in El Salvador. This will include supplying weapons and other needed equipment. The Reagan Administration has published documents giving details of the weapons given by communist nations, primarily Russia and Cuba, to the communistled forces in El Salvador. Even if such proof were not available, it would be prudent to assume that such help was being given in light of the doctrines, history, and objectives of the international communists.

Uncompromising Struggle Against Imperialism and anti?Communism

The conclusion is reached:

"The struggle against the reactionary and anti?communist forces of imperialism should be uncompromising. The Soviet Union stands firm in its intention to continue to follow its course towards the consolidation of positive shifts in the international arena, preservation of detente and consolidation of international security." (Page 77)

The Soviet Union affirms that it is engaged in an uncompromising struggle against the U.S.A. since it states the policy of the U.S.A. is IMPERIALISM. The U.S.A. is under constant attack which cannot be ignored. The U.S.A. must oppose communist attack but need not use all the methods and weapons the enemy uses. Communist falsehoods can be countered and defeated by the truth.

The people of the world can be encouraged in their struggle for freedom and prosperity.

The U.S.A. need not be neutral towards communist?led revolutions that have the announced objective of adding to the encirclement of this country. Revolution is not necessarily desirable and counter?revolution evil. Only those who accept the Marxist doctrines of the inevitability of communism believe that.

Can we take our stand unashamedly with those individuals and organizations that are striving to enlarge liberty?

SAKHAROV DESCRIBES HIS ISOLATION

Sakharov, the Soviet Scientist and leading dissident, has been exiled from Moscow to the City of Gorky. He describes his plight in a letter published in the December, 1980, issue of The Samizdat Bulletin No.92 pages 2 and 3.

"My isolation in Gorky is of an entirely different nature than appears from the conference. There is no scientific library across the street, to which I supposedly have access. There is only mud and piles of rubbish opposite our home. I have no contact with scientists in Gorky, not because there are only secret institutes here, but because I am in a state of almost total isolation, deprived of the possibility of meeting with anyone at all except my wife and two people from Gorky who obtained special permission for this from the KGB, and one visit from my university friend who also managed to get KGB permission. All others are stopped short by a militiaman, on duty around the clock, one meter from the door. I am not even aware of the majority of the visitors, while they are subjected to a great many troubles. Our friend and doctor, who traveled all the way from Leningrad, was not admitted, nor was our 80?year?old aunt from Moscow. Even a member of our family ??my son's fiancee Lisa Alexeyeva??? is not allowed to see me. The authorities will not allow her to leave the country to join the man she loves, and she is subjected to persecution and threats of physical and legal reprisals. Fear for her, for her life, compels my wife to divide her time between Gorky and Moscow.

"I have no telephone and I have no opportunity to call from the post office; I am deprived of medical aid by those doctors who used to treat me; my correspondence is being thoroughly checked by the KGB and only a fraction of the

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correspondence reaches me; in the house where I live there is a personal radio?jamming device.

"In July my wife surprised two KGB agents in our apartment. They entered through a window and, without the knowledge of the militiaman on duty, rummaged through my papers and erased tape recordings. Such illegal entries have occured before. I have not received a reply to a single one of my letters or telegrams to officials.

"I do not make it my task to give special support to the viewpoint of Western governments, or anyone else, but express precisely my own point of view on matters that concern me deeply. As for the mildness of the measures taken against me, they are, of course, not as severe as the terms of imprisonment of many years' duration for my friends and scientists??prisoners of conscience Sergei Kovalev, Yuri Orlov, Tolia [Anatoly] Shcharansky, Tanya Velikanova, Victor Nekipelov, nor as the fate of those awaiting trial??Alexander Lavut, Leonard Ternovsky, Tanya Osipova and many others. But my banishment, carried out without trial in violation of all constitutional guarantees, the isolation measures applied, interference of the KGB in my private life??all these are totally illegal and inadmissible because they are an infringement of my personal rights and a dangerous precedent of the actions of the authorities, who are casting aside even that pitiful imitation of legality in the persecution of dissidents that they had professed in recent years. Only a court has the right to establish that a law has been violated and to determine the degree of punishment. Any deliberations about culpability and mercy without a trial are inadmissible and illegal. Therefore, I am insistent in my demands for an open trial and attach fundamental importance to this.

A COMMUNIST VIEW OF CHANGES IN THE BRITISH LABOR PARTY

The U.S. Communists are delighted with the developments that have recently taken place within the British Labor Party. The "left wing" has secured constitutional changes which assure increased influence in and probable control over the Party which is likely to govern England before too long.

The present leader of the British Labor Party, Michael Foot, favors unilateral disarmament and increased nationalization of British industry despite the hideous record of those industries already nationalized. Both pro?Soviet and Trotskyist Communists are active in Labor Party affairs.

This situation has alarmed some of the more moderate leaders of the Party, and they have formed a Council for Social Democracy which many expect to develop into a new political party which will split the Labor Party vote. There is a possibility that such a new party may combine with the Liberal Party and receive a plurality of the vote at the next elections.

These developments have ominous implications for the historic alliance between the U.S.A. and England.

The following article, published in the Daily World, February 10, illustrates the communist view of this situation:

British left gains Labor Party control

LONDON (By mall) ? The battle for Britain's political future is now being fought out in the British Labor Party. At issue between the left and right wings of the party is the control of the party organization and the processes that determine what kind of policies would be carried out when a Labor Party government is elected.

Over the past year the Labor left wing has won one approval after another for its proposals for democratizing the party. On January 24, a special conference was called at Wembley in London to decide on a new method for choosing the party leader. The left won a massive victory for a proposal that puts the selection mainly in the hands of Labor's working class supporters.

The choosing of the party leader has been the privilege of the Labor members of Parliament (the Parliamentary Labor Party), the majority of whom have been right wing or center. This situation was reinforced by the party leadership's control over selection of parliamentary candidates. The party leader, who becomes prime minister in a government, has final say on the party's manifesto or program and has the appointing power in virtually all areas.

At the last Labor conference in October 1980 the left trend was dramatically shown in the adoption of an array of decisions to reverse right?wing control. Constituency parties were given the right to mandatory reselection of

candidates before elections (which works against the entrenchment of right?wing members of parliament). The party's national executive board, now with a left majority, gained the right to decide on the party manifiesto.

Finally, the decision to change the method of choosing the party leader was adopted and a proposal was projected for this to be done by an electoral college instead of by only the members of parliament.

Between October and the special conference held on January 24 an intense debate occurred in the Labor Party. When it became evident that the tide was moving to the left, a bloc of right?wing Laborites (known as the "Gang of Three," formerly from Callaghan's cabinet) tried to blackmail the party. They threatened to split the Labor Party by setting up a new party if control of the leadership choice was not kept by the parliamentary group.

The 1,130 delegates delivered a shattering blow to the right wingers. Using the block voting system, which reflects the membership of affiliated trade unions and other organizations, they approved the idea of an electoral college by 6,283,000 to 871,000.

A motion by the shopworkers' union was finally adopted. It stunned the right by giving 30 percent each to MPs and constituency parties and a whopping 40 percent to the trade unions. This was carried by 5,552,000 to 1,868,000.

The main leader of the Labor left, Tony Benn, hailed this decision as having "changed the course of British history."

This struggle within the Labor Party is occurring while the party is in opposition. It will have tremendous effect when the next Labor government is elected and when mass sentiment for change will be seen in operation. The last Labor conference, for example, went on record for unilateral nuclear disarmament, for rejecting deployment of U.S. cruise missiles, for extensive nationalization of industry, and for other measures that would radically alter both foreign and domestic policies.

COMMUNIST INFILTRATION OF THE U.S ARMY

The Progressive Labor Party (PLP) is making a major effort to infiltrate the Armed Forces of the U.S.A. The Party leadership in 1978 instructed all its youthful members to join the army upon graduation from high school.

These communists state frankly that their purpose in joining the army is to receive weapons and the training to use them so that, when the time is ripe, their weapons may be used for mutiny and to shoot U. S. officers. Their policy is based on the instructions of Lenin during the First World War: "Soldiers of all armies, turn your guns against your own officers. Shoot them down like dogs."

The correspondence columns of the official PLP publication, "Challenge the Revolutionary Communist newspaper, are filled with reports from young communists who have joined or are joining the Armed Forces. Consider these significant statements:

"I am a member of the PLP and I have recently enlisted in the army to build an antiracist revolutionary movement to turn the guns around for working class power. I am stationed at Ft. Eustis, Va.

"As a member of the PLP, I have found a lot of support for our line among working class GIs whom the bosses want to portray as super?patriots all. Numbers of my friends here are considering joining InCAR and they will. But if more of us were here now, they would be joining sooner. Friends who say they won't join have offered to protect me from bodily harm. Many know that I am a red out to build a communist movement inside the military.

"When I first joined up, I didn't think I could convince GIs, of the need to turn the guns around for proletarian power, but how wrong I was." (January 14, page 5) [Note: The International Committee Against Racism (InCAR) is a front organization of the PLP]

"I am about to join the National Guard to organize for the Party.

"When the Party made a decision in 1978 to have all high school student comrades join the Army upon graduation, I said, 'Great, this just what the Patty needs.' That was until I realized that meant me also. As my graduation date

neared, I came up with more and more reasons not to sign up. 'Look at the trouble I have doing my Party work now, under good conditions. I wont be able to do anything in the Army.'

"Looking back, I was scared of the Army, and to a certain extent, I still am. But other things have changed. In 1978, while I told my friends that I thought a war was coming, I did not really believe in either of these things. But in the last few years, several things have happened. First there were the Iran, Nicaragua, and Afghanistan 'crises.' Second, I saw the crisis within the capitalist system here sharpen. Both of these things convinced me that 1) war was inevitable, and 2) the ruling class was going to have to resort to fascism to insure a 'patriotic' backing for the war.

"I picked the Guard for several reasons. First, I am in college now and the Guard has a special program for college students. They will let you take Basic Training this summer and Advanced Individual Training next summer. This allows college students to continue going to school while they are serving their term. More importantly, when the workers start to fight back against this war, and the fascism that comes with it, it will be the Guard that is the first called out to put down these rebellions. That is why it is important for PLP to organize in the armed forces. We must convince the workers in the Guard and the Army not to fight other workers either overseas or at home for the bosses interests. The only alternative is to turn the guns around and fight for socialism." (Feb. 4, page 5)

The members of the PLP act as well as talk. They have already commenced organization within the Army. They are organizing opposition to the Ku Klux Klan in order to contact recruits who may be enticed into InCAR and thence into the PLP:

Soldiers Organize Against Bosses' War Plans

FT. EUSTIS, Va., Jan. 18?Under the leadership of a member of the. Progressive Labor Party, seven soldiers from this Army base met today to discuss building an anti?racist and anti?imperialist war movement inside the military. It was a multi?racial collective of privates who were pissed off with the racism growing inside the service. They all decided that they won't fight in an imperialist war. They were also very interested in building the International Committee Against Racism.

It was decided to issue a leaflet attacking the growth of the Ku Klux Klan inside the military, a follow?up to a previous flyer?Smash the Klan?that had been distributed on the base. There are now more soldiers involved in writing and distributing the literature. Right after the meeting, one soldier posted an InCAR leaflet on the bulletin board and all the soldiers at the meeting are now working towards bringing friends to the next meeting. At this pace, the numbers of soldiers involved in fighting back against the brass in an organized way will no doubt increase.

The main idea that the soldiers want to get across in their leaflet is that they are opposed to imperialism. They know the bosses are looking for a battlefield to send them into. As soldiers, they hold a lot of power to determine what kind of war they fight. At the meeting, for example, they discussed the horrors of Vietnam and what made that an imperialist war.

Many of these soldiers will be sent to Germany, separated from their wives and families. It's clear that the bosses have their eyes on Poland because almost everyone in the company is being sent to Germany, Poland's neighbor. Those at the meeting promised to keep in touch with InCAR and to distribute the anti?racist literature wherever they are stationed.

These anti?racist soldiers also issued a warning to other youth who are being wooed by military recruiters. When the recruiters say that the Army is more that just a job??you'd better believe it. Once you sign, they own you day and night. The hours and the pay stink. Building InCAR inside the bosses' Army makes it all worthwhile. Soldiers united against racism and imperialist war will help decide the direction of the working class struggle in the years to come.

All rank and file soldiers are urged to join InCAR. Three soldiers at the meeting took membership cards and plan to join. Sell the InCAR Arrow?Flecha and spread the word. There is a strong feeling of anti?racism among many soldiers. The military is wide open for antiracist InCAR organizers.

THE SADISM OF MAO TSE?TUNG

Mao Tse?tung, by his own confession, would have made an enthusiastic member of the Charles Manson family. He not only killed, he rejoiced in killing.

The Revolutionary Communist Party, whose members remain idolators of Mao, has published extensive "Quotations from Mao Tse?tung" in the January 30, 1981 edition of their newspaper, Revolutionary Worker. Consider this quotation:

"(Emperor Chin Shih?huang) was an expert in respecting the modern and belittling the ancient..." (Line Biao interrupts) "Chin Shih?huang burned the books and buried the scholars alive." "What did he amount to? He only buried alive 460 scholars while we buried 46,000 In our suppression of the counterrevolutionaries did we not kill some counterrevolutionary intellectuals I once debated with the democratic people You accuse us of acting like Chin Shih?huang but you are wrong we surpass him 100 times You berate us for imitating Chin Shih?huang in enforcing dictatorship. We admit them all. What is regrettable is that you did not say enough. We have had to say it for you." (Page 17)

GUS HALL REVIEWS COMMUNIST PROGRESS IN THE U.S.A

Gus Hall, general secretary of the Communist Party, U.S.A. (CPUSA), and its undisputed leader, was the communist candidate for President in the recent election. He presented his analysis of the vote he received in a political report to the Central Committee of the Party. Extracts of this report were published in the January, 1981, edition of the Theoretical Journal of the Communist Party, Political Affairs from which this statement is taken:

We don't have and never will have all the vote totals our Party received, but there are a number of conclusions I would like to draw based on the voting patterns and the statistics we do have:

1) We are clearly building a Communist constituency.

2) Most important in this election is the fact that in spite of the increased number of Left and independent candidates in the field we increased our total number of votes. The top votes in Illinois, Ohio, Washington State, Washington, D.C. and Connecticut puts us in the 1?2 per cent of total vote bracket. In one or two cities and districts the Party vote was in the 5 per cent range, and in Seattle it was at the 10 per cent level. And, led by Chicago, in a growing number of cities and states we came in fourth after Anderson.

Based on our top vote in the 25 states where we were on the ballot our estimate is that the total will be about 157,000. When you add states like California, Massachusetts, Connecticut and Florida, where we were not on the ballot and where we could expect big totals, we can honestly speak of a total Communist vote in the 250,000 or more range.

3) Analysis and assessment of our campaign must be within the context that it was carried out in the midst of a greatly intensified antiCommunist and anti?Soviet campaign that has reached hysteria proportions. Especially viewed within this context, for instance, the nearly onehalf million signatures on Communist petitions is a heroic achievement. And of all the Left candidates we face the greatest obstacles, the most vote stealing and the sharpest attacks by the enemy. In fact there were very few attacks on the other Left candidates.

The new level of acceptance of our Party was evident in the treatment accorded us by the mass media, in the absence of harassment of our petition circulators and in the generally respectful and often friendly reception which they were given. It was also evident in the treatment of our Party by most election officials and the courts.

WILL SOVIET HISTORY BE REPEATED IN THE U.S.A.?

Andrei Sakharov, the dissident Soviet Scientist, gives a summary of the record of communist conduct in the Soviet Union in an open letter to the President of the Soviet Academy of Sciences, A. P. Alexandrov. This letter is published in the Samizdat Bulletin No. 93, January, 1981:

"Our country has lived half its history under the monstrous crimes of the Stalin regime. Although Stalin's actions have been officially condemned by word?ofmouth, the scale of Stalin's crimes and their concrete manifestations are carefully concealed from the people and those who expose them are prosecuted for alleged slander. The terror and

famine accompanying collectivization, Kirov's murder and the destruction of the cultural, civil, military, and party personnel, the genocide that occurred during the resettlement of 'punished' peoples, the penal labor camps and the deaths of many millions there, the flirtation with Hitler which turned into a national tragedy, the repression of prisoners of war, the anti?labor laws, the murder of Mikhoels and the resurgence of official anti?Semitism, all these evils should be exposed with absolute finality. A people without historical memory is doomed to degradation." (Page 3)

The U. S. people, who are threatened with the imposition of a communist dictatorship as a result of worldwide programs in tune with the communist formula for the conquest of the U.S. A., "External encirclement, plus internal demoralization, plus thermonuclear blackmail, lead to progressive surrender," should also pay attention to history. "Those who will not learn the lessons of history are condemned to repeat them."

Sweet are the uses of adversity Which, like the toad, ugly and venomous Wears yet a precious jewel in his head. (Shakespeare??As You Like It)

In the last election, many liberals, such as Senator George McGovern, suffered humiliating defeats. In this adversity they have found a jewel??the ability to raise large sums of money from scared supporters. The executive editor of the New Republic Morton Kondracke, reports in the February 21 edition of that journal, "Americans for Democratic Action, the American Civil Liberties Union, the Arms Control Association, and the National Abortion Rights Action League" all report record responses to their fund?raising appeals since the Republicans won in November.

I am the privileged recipient of a fund?raising letter from ex?Senator George McGovern.

The letter begins with a slashing attack on the "New Right" which is, he states, "Seeking to destroy our basic it.Lgh,t6 and individual liberties." He laments proposals to:

Restore prayer in public schools; Prohibit Federal programs to fund the treatment of venereal disease, contraceptives and abortion; Prevent State and Federal authorities from "impeding" public schools; Halt Federal protection of those with "perverse life?styles," e. g. Homosexuality; Allow parents to review textbooks before their use in public schools

To prevent disasters of this magnitude overwhelming this republic, he pleads for funds?and it works. The money is rolling in.

The other side of the coin is that conservatives and anticommunists tend to relax and enjoy the statements and policies of the new Administration. These seem prosperous times for the anticommunist cause. The President and Secretary of State understand the communist menace, and many feel we can leave our destiny in their hands. The result is that the sense of imminent danger, which leads to sacrificial giving, is lost. Consequently, the Crusade income has fallen precipitously this past month.

This is the time to press ahead with our programs, not to retrench. We must have support for our Million Dollar Fund to conduct a worldwide Truth Campaign exposing the hideous nature and record of communism. Specific needs include:
