DOES REVOLUTION IN CENTRAL AMEIRCA THREATEN THE U.S.A.?

SENATOR WILLIAM PROXMIRE Vs. COMMANDER TOMAS BORGE

Senator William Proxmire states in his August report from Washington:

"Looked at realistically, even if all the countries of Central America came together in union against the United States, they would pose no genuine military threat to us. They just don't have the economic or military resources to be a threat to us."

Tomas Borge, Minister of the Interior of Nicaragua and sole surviving founder of the Sandinista National Liberation Front tells a visiting group of Canadians:

"If all the Nicaraguans would have to die, as a price for the solidarity that we feel for Central America, for the Latin American revolutions, we would, without vacillating, give our lives. Imperialism doesn't understand that." (Intercontinental Press, September, 1983, page 517)

Borge makes it clear that the Nicaraguan Revolution is subordinate to the World Revolution to which Konstantin Chernenko, the Soviet second-in-command, refers when he states:

"Soviet power gave the world dictatorship of the proletariat, and world revolution priority over any national sacrifices, however hard they may be,' Lenin wrote. The Soviet Union has repeatedly proved its loyalty to that behest of Lenin." (Soviet World Outlook, February 15, 1983)

I wonder if Senator Proxmire could say: "Even is all the assets of the countries of Central America were added to those of the Soviet Union and the Communist Empire, they would pose no genuine military threat to us."

As Tomas Borge and Konstantin Cherenenko make so clear, the revolutions in Central America are not isolated phenomena. If these revolutions are successful, these countries will not be left to their own resources even as Cuba has not been left to its own resources. The countries would be militarized, and consistent attempts would be made to inculcate suicidal fanaticism into the youth. Propaganda against the U.S.A. would be designed to create hatred of this country. Airports would be built from which planes and missiles could be targeted, and possibly launched, against the U.S.A. Submarine bases would be constructed which would enable Soviet submarines to prowl the Caribbean, blockade the Panama Canal, and launch missiles against the U.S.A. if hostilities developed; massive armies would be available to overwhelm the borders of the U.S.A.

I doubt that Senator Proxmire can believe or contend that such a situation would pose no genuine military threat to the U.S.A. An appropriate statement for Senator Proxmire and all true lover of freedom to make, would be: "Looked at realistically, if all the countries of Central America came together in union against the United States, and in cooperation with the Soviet Union, the military threat to the United States would be magnified greatly. This must not be permitted."

LESSONS FROM THE FORMULA FOR THE COMMUNIST CONQUEST OF THE U.S.A. (Part 4)

This is the fourth installment in this series. The formula for the communist conquest of the U.S.A. is: "External encirclement, plus internal demoralization, plus thermonuclear blackmail, lead to progressive surrender." The process of INTERNAL DEMOARLIZATION is being discussed.

Destruction of the Family

While individuals are the atoms, the family is the molecule with which society is built. Strong families make strong nations. Since the reverse is also true, undermining the family is the preferred way to weaken a nation.

Classical communist doctrine taught that the family was a creation of the capitalist economic system, and that the destruction of capitalism would lead to the absolution of the family. Karl Marx and Frederick Engels stated in their famous Communist Manifesto:

"On what is the present family, the bourgeois family based. On capital or private gain. And, "The Bourgeois family will vanish as a matter of course... with the vanishing of capital."

When the communists conquered Russia, they proceeded to enact legislation that would undermine the family. Progressive education was introduced, divorce was made easy, and family loyalties were undermined. Experience soon taught them that these policies weakened the nation so they were abandoned in Russia. They were continued in the countries which had not yet been conquered since weakness would make conquest easier.

It is in the family that the virtues which maintain civilized society are learned. Family members learn loyalty, obedience and love. They learn to subordinate self to others and to share their possessions. Transferred to the largest family, the nation, these virtues given integrity and strength.

Who can deny that the family I n the United States is being attacked and weakened? Social forces, aided by "progressive legislation" are ministering to the disintegration of the family with resultant one-parent families, poverty, latchkey children, illiteracy, illegitimacy, and child abuse. The black family has born the brunt of these social and economic forces with deadly results.

The situation of the black family is described in the September 19 edition of the liberal NEW REPUBLIC magazine. The editors are reluctant to discuss the situation because it will lay them open to the charge of racism. Nevertheless, convinced that the situation is so series, they write:

"There is a specter at once haunting and inhibiting the economic and social progress of black Americans. It is almost impossible to allude to it without being accused of racism. But it is a tragic truth on which the indices of black poverty, statistical and psychological are based. There is an epidemic--the metaphor of pathology is not inappropriate, for what is involved is the health of the black community -- of single-parent families, unmarried mothers, deserting fathers. Recent figures from the Bureau of the Census show the extent of the epidemic. Forty-one percent of black families are headed by women without husbands present, up almost a third in the last decade. The divorce rate among blacks has more than doubled in a decade, and is now double that of whites. The percentage of black children living in one parent homes rose from 32 percent to 49 percent in the same period; these children's homes may account for close to 80 percent of the black poor. Its obvious why these families are poorer; none of them has income from two wage earners, few from even one. Most are supported by the welfare system. Even more to the point is the social contagion of teenage pregnancies, which would only be exacerbated were the Administration's ware on abortion option to succeed. But even with widely available birth control information and publicly funded abortions (not exactly an ideal expenditure of social capital), the demographics tell a terrible story, presage a worse one: young women, girls really, still children themselves having children, passing on depression and helplessness from generation to generation... The fertility fate of black teenagers in the United States is by far the highest in the developed world. For every thousand black females under nineteen, most of them unmarried, there are 515 children born into all kinds of disadvantages of life: inadequate mothering or worse, the absence of a father, the chintzy and humiliating public dole as the most common source of income, the trap of dependence. Among teenagers between fourteen and seventeen in the West, black fertility exceeds the next highest rate by a factor of 2.5 to 1. For unmarried mothers of all ages the ratio of black to white is almost 5 to 1; for ages fifteen to nineteen, the ratio is almost 6 to 1. This is a demographic disaster??nothing less. (Page 10)

The black family has suffered most, but a similar disintegration is taking place in the white family due to the operation of the same forces, although it has not yet advanced so far.

The disintegration of family cannot be blamed upon the communists alone despite the fact that the demoralization and

disintegration of the family was extolled by Marx and Engels in the Communist Manifesto which they wrote in 1848. Other destructive forces are playing their role. One of these is hedonism.

The Cult of Self?indulgence

Hedonism is the order of the day. The cult of self?indulgence rules. The slogan is, "if it feels good, do it." Permissive sex has been promoted by music, advertising, education, and legislation. Homosexuality is first recognized as normal behavior, then legalized, and finally advertised and encouraged. Permissive abortion is made legal and those who believe it is murder are compelled to pay for abortions with their taxes.

Paradoxical results puzzle those who think mechanically and amorally. The availability of contraception leads to an increase in illegitimate births. The availability of consensual sex leads to an increase in rape.

There is nothing paradoxical, however, about the increase in venereal disease. Promiscuity has led to an epidemic of venereal disease, particularly incurable Herpes and now AIDS. Organizations, such as Planned Parenthood and SIECUS, which concentrate upon making contraceptives readily available and thereby encourage promiscuity, have encouraged the spread of venereal disease.

The cult of promiscuity has infiltrated the schools in the guise of amoral sex education.

The concept of sin has almost disappeared in large segments of Christian theology. It has been replaced by the concept of self?love. A return to the teaching of Jesus is desperately needed. He said: "If any man would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow Me."

The communists are counting upon the decline in patriotism, the disintegration of the family, and the cult of self? indulgence to create a society without the will to sacrifice so that the U.S. will surrender when the crisis comes.

COMMUNISM IN AUSTRALIA

[The following article describes the communist movement in Australia. Some of the names are different, but there is great similarity between the communist situation in Australia and the U.S.A. ??Editor]

The Communist Party of Australia (CPA) was formed in 1920. It became a member of Lenin's "Communist International" and, upon his death, transferred its obedience to Joseph Stalin whom it served as a faithful slave.

For years our local comrades had heard ugly stories coming from the Soviet Union. There were stories of massive famine, of purges in which countless thousands were murdered, and of concentration camps in which millions were incarcerated. But, blinded by their faith in communism, they had denounced these stories as "counter?revolutionary lies." Despite the overwhelming evidence of the atrocities of communism in the Soviet Union, the C.P.A. remained a relatively united, "Stalinist" party until 1956.

In 1956, two events shook communists throughout the world. Firstly, Khrushchev, in what is known as the "secret speech" to the 20th Congress of the Communist Party of the Soviet Union, acknowledged some of the brutalities of Stalin. Then, as an act of "peace" the Soviet Union crushed the revolt in Hungary.

These events caused some comrades to give up their communism, in disillusion. Others refused to condemn Joseph Stalin saying that criticism of Stalin amounted to criticism of communism itself. Some supported the invasion of Hungary, but criticized the Soviet Union for its.criticism of Stalin. Other comrades accepted some criticism of Stalin's excesses, but supported the Soviet invasion of Hungary. Yet others accepted the criticism of Stalin, but did not accept the Soviet invasion of Hungary. Thus were the seeds sown for the splinte ing of the Australian Communist Party.

The First Split and the Creation of the Communist Party (Marxist?Leninist

In 1964, with great bitterness, the first split in the communist party occurred. Those who supported Stalin

wholeheartedly now attached themselves to the man they believed to possess "the quintessence of working?class wisdom, Mao Tse?tung." They formed the Communist Party (Marxist?Leninist), [CPML].

This party continues as a small party with only several hundred members. It is led by the very capable Ted Hill; but the most prominent member is Norm Gallagher, leader of the Builders Labourers Federation.

Evidence of the disaster that Mao inflicted upon, his country by such things as "the great leap forward" and the dreadful "cultural revolution" has not caused the CPML to repudiate their Maoism. The journal of the CPML, the AUSTRALIAN COMMUNIST, while admitting that the party may have "overstated (Mao's) position", nevertheless describes him "as a titanic figure 'f Marxism who made an immortal contribution to the Chinese and world revolution. His work will live forever. It is of immeasurable assistance in the solution o? all problems." The CPML proclaims that it is still "absolutely imperative for all communists to drink deep, deep indeed, of Marxism?Leninism??Mao Tse?tung thought."

While commitment to Maoism remains unchanged, devotion to the Soviet Union has been replaced by "furious hatred." The CPML accepts the conclusion of Peking that Russia is now the greatest danger to the success of communism throughout the world. The Chinese Communists teach that Russia has backslidden into imperialism. Accordingly the CPML no preaches about the dangers posed by Russia. The CPML proclaims that Soviet imperialists are seen to "spare absolutely no effort in their expansion" because "a military?industrial complex is the core of the Soviet state Bourgeoisie. The only return on such an enormous investment in arms is to use them, and this is precisely what the Russian bourgeoisie intends."

The CPML has therefore been a major opponent of the current "peace movement" in Australia. The CPML believes that the movement is orchestrated by Russia, in the interests of the expansion of that country's policies. Warnings of the dangers to Australia due to the Soviet presence in Vietnam, are regularly issued in the CPML's newspaper, THE VANGUARD.

The CPML operates a string of East Wind Bookshops which promote a large range of Chinese communist literature. It seeks converts from the "instant experts" created by the boom in tourist travel to China.

The main union base for the CPML is the Builders Labourers Federation, of which Norm Gallagher is secretary. Ted Bull, vice?chairman of the CPML, is prominent in the Victorian Branch of the Waterside Workers Federation.

The CPML has not renounced the ultimate fight with the West, but believes it will come after the victory over Russia. In preparation for the fight against capitalism, the CPML maintains it is necessary to have "well selected communists working appropriately and biding their time" within Western society.

Recently, there have been "talks" between the CPML and the Communist Party of Australia. It is difficult to assess their significance. Internationally, although Peking avows "furious hatred" for Russia, it should never be forgotten that both are Marxist?Leninist countries. In this sense they are squabbling brothers. And blood brothers may suddenly unite in common cause.

The Second Split and the Creation of the Socialist Party of Australia (SPA)

A number of the leaders of the CPA had developed sympathy with some of the leaders of the party in Czechoslovakia. Therefore, when the Soviet tanks crushed Prague, they also trampled upon the feelings of some of our local comrades. Great tension developed within the CPA between those who defended the Soviet invasion and those who could not accept it. Eventually the pro?Soviet hardliners left the CPA in the second great split. They formed the pro?Soviet Socialist Party of Australia (SPA) in 1971.

The party has a membership of about 1,000 people and only considerable help from "outside" could account for its expensive headquarters; its election campaigns; its publication of a regular newspaper??the SOCIALIST, and a theoretical journal??the AUSTRALIAN MARXIST REVIEW, as well as regular theoretical publications; and the funding of scholarships to the Soviet Union and other conferences.

The SPA considers itself to be the "great continuer" of true Marxism?Leninism, i.e. true communism. It has certainly

continued a path of relentless devotion to the Soviet Union, and was acclaimed by the communist party of that country for carrying on "with flying colors the glorious Marxist?Leninist traditions." The president of the party said, "we communists left (the CPA) in 1971 because we felt the CPA had moved from Marxism?Leninism." He criticized the CPA for having "started on the slippery road of anti ?Sovietism." (With its criticism of the Soviet intervention in Hungary and Czechoslovakia)

Peace Movements

The SPA helped in the formation of one of the leading "peace" organizations in Australia, the Australian Peace Committee. This organization is now the local affiliate of the international pro? Soviet World Peace Council.

The SPA is committed to an interpretation of peace in which the Soviet Union is the "camp of peace" threatened by the "camp of imperialism"??the United States of America. The "peace activities" of the SPA have been its priority for several years. They have included support for the Soviet involvement in Hungary, Czechoslovakia, Afghanistan and the oppression of the Polish Solidarity organization. SPA members have been at the forefront of "nuclear?free Pacific campaigns" and are leaders in the campaign of opposition against the bases and facilities the United States of America operates here and against the ANZUS pact. The SPA has been an enthusiastic promoter of "peace kits" for distribution among our school children.

The SPA has also promoted the World Federation of Trade Unions which is the international union organization serving the Soviet cause. A regional offshoot from the WFTU, the Committee for International Trade Union Unity (CITUU), has been very active in promoting the Soviet interpretation of "peace" through trade unions in Asia and the Pacific.

Formation of the Australian Marxist Forum

Recently the SPA has suffered a great upheaval. The president of the party, Pat Clancy, president also of the Building Workers Industrial Union (BWIU), has led a union defection from the SPA. In 1982, Mr. Clancy was co?signatory to the formation of ,a new organization "The Australian Marxist Forum." Leading members of the SPA have resigned from that party and almost the whole of its union base has moved with Clancy into the Marxist Forum.

In the last few years, Clancy has led an attempt at reunification between the SPA and the CPA. With the creation of the Marxist Forum, he may well have been successful. The Forum comprises the former industrial wing of the SPA, the CPA, certain left?leaning members of the Labor Party and even representatives from the Trotskyist Socialist Workers Party.

Although Clancy has ceased to be the president of the SPA, he is still a leader in the World Federation of Trade Unions and the World Peace Council. It can, therefore, be assumed that he has not fallen from the grace of Moscow and that the Soviet Union is pleased with the creation of the Australian Marxist Forum.

Present State of the Communist of Australia

The CPA is the largest communist party in Australia with an estimated membership of 2,000. It produces a weekly newspaper, the TRIBUNE, and a theoretical journal, the AUSTRALIAN LEFT REVIEW. It has headquarters in most Australian states.

The CPA has been less dogmatic than the other communist parties, and it advocates adherence to the spirit, rather than the letter of the written Marxist?Leninist text. While still thoroughly Marxist, the party has questioned some of the dogmas of Lenin. While the CPA still believes that a unified party is necessary to lead and co?ordinate the revolution, it has expressed some difficulty with the Leninist concept of rigid party discipline. The CPA has thus campaigned as a "democratic" humanitarian organization. It has sought and found popularity, and increased membership, in the "fringe" issues of homosexuality, feminism and ecology.

A major preoccupation of the party has been the "peace movement." Although the CPA has criticized the Soviet invasions of certain countries, it obviously still believes that the Soviet Union is essentially "a camp of peace" threatened by "a camp of imperialist war"??the United States of America. The CPA has thus campaigned against the

"warlike" bases of the United States of America in this country, and against the ANZUS pact. The CPA has consistently supported communist "peace" in Vietnam and urges the support of similar wars of "liberation." The CPA has itself been prominent in various peace campaigns and certain of its members are leaders in the established peace organizations. For example, two of its national leader and several known supporters are on the committee of the Association for International Cooperation and Disarmament, which is the most prominent "peace" organization in the major Australian state, New South Wales.

Trotskyists

There are several groups of Marxist?Leninists who claim that Trotsky's insistence upon permanent worldwide revolution has been neglected. They believe the Soviet Union has concentrated upon "socialism" in that one country to the neglect of its international responsibility for revolution. These groups include the Socialist Labour League and the Socialist Workers Party. Because of their militancy these parties have been attractive to young people and have polled surprisingly well in recent elections. While bitterly criticizing each other for deviations from the alleged faith, they are unanimous in support for wars of Marxist liberation??from Vietnam to El Salvador.

Conclusion

Despite their small numbers, Marxists have a great influence in Australian society. They operate in many areas including:

- 1. Morality By giving organizational skill to such campaigns as those seeking legitimacy for homosexuality and permissive abortion, Marxists have helped alter the social standards in this country.
- 2. Economy All Marxists believe that capitalism will suffer recurrent, worsening, economic crises, and will eventually be overthrown. They believe they have a responsibility to aid this process of revolution, and therefore they seek to exaggerate all economic troubles. They seek to inflame class tensions by provoking economic strife.
- 3. Foreign Policy The major victory of Marxists has been, not to convince the majority that the Soviet Union is a wonderful place, for most people know it is not, but to persuade significant numbers of the Australian people that the U.S.A. is just as bad as the Soviet Union. For all its faults, the U.S.A. is a democracy; and for any of its sup posed attractions, the Soviet Union is a totalitarian police state. The two super?power are not the same. However, the Marxists, through their peace movement, are urging Australians to disassociate from the United States of America and to seek some kind of international "non?alignment". This will lead to the removal of U.S. bases and facilitie from this country and the abrogration of the ANZUS pact.

Marxists have also been responsible for the delusion in this country that "peace" has been declared in Vietnam. Similarly they urge that Marxist guerrillas should bring "peace" to Central America.

PERIL IN THE PHILIPPINES

As I write this, violent demonstrations and clashes are taking place in the Philippines as that country trembles on the brink of revolutionary civil war. At the same time, Dr. John Whitehall, born again Christian, pediatrician, anti? communist, and our foster son, is leading a Crusade team in conducting a series of anti?communist seminars.

When the assassination of the leader of the opposition to President Marcos, Benigno S. Aquino, was announced, I foresaw the trouble that would ensue and immediately contacted John to discuss whether prudence dictated the cancellation of the seminars. John was reluctant to do so since the need and the opportunities are so great. He contacted our Philippines brother who was organizing the meetings, and they decided that the program should proceed. I confess that I will breathe a sigh of relief when they return safely.

John is no stranger to danger. When the Portuguese had evacuated their most distant colony, East Timor, which lies to the north of Australia, civil war broke out, and there was no doctor in the entire country. John went into the midst of the fighting, under cover of an improvised Red Cross flag, and immediately performed surgery on 70 wounded men who were unattended.

It is sometimes difficult to discern the border between courage and foolhardiness. John has the responsibility of caring for 6 children, in partnership with his wife Elsie, so he cannot afford to be foolhardy. Nevertheless, he feels Christians should match the communists in courage and commitment, and that he is not caring for his children if he leaves them a future of communist enslavement and slaughter.

These seminars are reaping a magnificent harvest. The following letters are typical of hundreds that are flooding into our office:

1. "In November, 1981, we attended the seminar held at Doane Baptist College where Australian lecturers exposed the communist aims to weaken and destroy our government.

"My brother was a lecturer for the communist New People's Army. I gave him the pamphlets 'Why I Am Against Communism' and 'Lectures on the Theory and Practice of Communism'. At first he got angry. Then we had a hot argument. But after a month of thorough discussion and much prayer, he got saved and is radically changed. He is now willing to work with me."
