THE AIDS EPIDEMIC

"Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS) is currently doubling in less -than-a-year intervals and spreading into the heterosexual population--a SWORD OF DAMOCLES of unbelievable proportions."

This alarming statement, which utilizes the symbolism of the ancient myth about the guest who had to sit at the feast with a sword suspended by a single hair above his head, appears in the March 22 edition of the prestigious, authoritative magazine, SCIENCE. This magazine is not noted for panic or overstatement.

The slick left-liberal magazine, MOTHER JONES, which has promoted sexual promiscuity consistently and ardently, is also alarmed. It states: "The deadly AIDS epidemic has put the entire nation at risk."

There is just cause for alarm. AIDS is threatening to wipe out a substantial percentage of the U.S. population in the next decade. Let us think the unthinkable and contemplate what the future will bring to pass if the present doubling of the number of victims each year continues:

1985--8,000 VICTIMS; 1986--16,000 VICTIMS; 1987--32,000 VICTIMS; 1988--64,000 VICTIMS; 1989--128,000 VICTIMS; 1990--256,000 VICTIMS; 1991--512,000 VICTIMS; 1992--1,024,000 VICTIMS.

Continuing this process, almost the entire population of the U .S .A. would be afflicted by the year 2000. AIDS has the destructive potential of the nuclear bomb.

Curbing the Spread of AIDS

This process cannot be allowed to continue. It is not self-terminating, but some procedures are available to halt it. These include:

1. The production of a vaccine which will confer immunity against AIDS

There are bright prospects for success in the quest for such a vaccine, but responsible scientists consider that its availability is several years away. The virus associated with AIDS has been isolated, and a test is now available which will reveal with moderate accuracy those people who have antibodies to the AIDS virus in their blood. This is progress, but future developments are hard to predict.

2. The discovery of a medication which will be effective in treating the AIDS disease itself

If and when this will come to pass is speculation. However much money is invested in the search, there is no guarantee of success.

3. Prevention of the conduct which promotes the spread of AIDS

AIDS originated in association with homosexual promiscuity; it is spreading to the heterosexual population by bisexual promiscuity; and it will spread throughout the heterosexual community by heterosexual promiscuity. Other methods of spreading, such as blood transfusions, are deadly but secondary.

Promiscuity is the primary vehicle for the dissemination of AIDS, and it should therefore be curbed in every way possible. Education and religion have their role to play in this battle, but they should be assisted by appropriate legislation which makes promiscuity illegal because of the threat it poses to the health and life of all.

All institutions that promote promiscuity, such as bathhouses and singles bars, should be closed immediately. Conduct likely to spread AIDS should be a crime.

How the Communists Could Eliminate AIDS

There is a method by which the AIDS epidemic could be controlled. It harmonizes with basic communist philosophy, but it conflicts with Christianity.

Communism teaches that all humans are merely animals and that there is no continuity of life. It is, therefore, permissible to eliminate the entire class which includes diseased animals in the quest to create superior ones. Various communist rulers have conducted practical programs using this principle.

Consider how diseases are sometimes controlled in animal husbandry. As an example, take the case of how tuberculosis was eliminated from the dairy herds, and thereby from the milk of the nation.

Some cows were infected by the tuberculosis bacillus and transmitted this bacillus to their milk, thereby threatening the health of those who drank it. Scientists developed a test to determine which cows had been in contact with the tuberculosis bacillus. It was known as the "tuberculin skin test".

The test did not reveal which cows had tuberculosis; it indicated which cows might have it. It detected those cows which had been in contact with the bacillus and had fought against it.

The fight with the tuberculosis bacillus could end in two ways: 1) The cow could win and develop a relative immunity to the disease; 2) The bacillus could win and set up housekeeping in lesions in the body of the cow.

Both the immune and the infected reacted positively to the skin test. All those animals with a positive reaction were slaughtered in order to make sure that all the infected cattle were eliminated. The innocent were killed with the guilty. It was cruel but effective. Today, milk can be drunk in the U.S.A. without fear of contracting the dread disease.

Communist doctrine would direct the communists to undertake such a "scientific" program to eliminate AIDS from any population they controlled if an AIDS epidemic was rife. Christian doctrine would direct that an attempt should be made to determine which individuals actually suffered from the disease and to treat them as humanely as possible.

In order to eliminate the possibility of drastic treatment, based on animal husbandry, it is necessary to assure that the communist program to establish their dictatorship over the whole world, which includes the U.S.A., does not succeed. An essential element in their program to conquer the U.S.A. is the demoralization of U.S. society. Promiscuity is part of this demoralization.

Disease Sin Crime

For centuries, homosexual conduct was regarded as a disease by the medical profession, as immoral by religious institutions, and as illegal by government. In the past two decades, this has changed dramatically. The medical profession removed the stigma of disease from homosexual conduct, legislatures removed the stigma of crime, and some religious bodies removed the stigma of sin. The results are now evident. Promiscuity increased exponentially. Investigations have reported that many homosexuals have had more than 500 sexual partners. AIDS now threatens the health and lives of all.

Many excuse homosexual conduct on the grounds that a homosexual has innate urges and preferences over which he has no control. Impulses are one thing; yielding to those impulses is another. Many people are born with a bad temper. This does not excuse their indulgence in acts of violence. They must be taught that violence is wrong and aided in self-control by the knowledge that indulgence will result in legal punishment.

The argument that homosexual conduct between consenting adults hurts only the participants has now lost all validity. Homosexual promiscuity threatens all with AIDS.

Legislatures, churches, and physicians must combine to protect the community health by stripping the camouflage of legality, morality and normality from this disease-generating life style.

SELF-REVELATION

This cartoon appeared in the May 9 edition of the WORKERS WORLD newspaper. This periodical is published by the Trotskyist Communist sect The Workers World Party, led by Sam Marcey. It gives an insight into the seething cesspool which constitutes the communist mind:

THE DEADLY MIRAGE OF COMMUNISM

Communism seduces the idealistic youth by presenting a false but attractive vision of the future man and society which they promise to create.

Tomas Borge, Minister of the Interior of Nicaragua articulates this vision skillfully. He is head of the Police, the Militia, and the Sandinista Committees for the Defense of the Revolution in Nicaragua and is in charge of the forces of coercion. He justifies the present by the hypothetical future.

The Trotskyist Communists have published in the April edition of the INTERNATIONAL SOCIALIST REVIEW, a speech Borge made to members of State Security, the Sandinista Police, and the Fire Department on October, 1974 in Managua. Anyone who doubts that the Sandinista regime is orthodox Marxist-Leninist, should read this speech. Borge states:

"We still have before us the objective of building a new society that will embody the paradise of the imagination, the paradise of human solidarity, where the highest form of property will be the responsibility of all of mankind to all of mankind.

"To lose sight of the final objective would be like constructing a building without plans or drawings, creating a useless framework of iron and cement...

"Building this new society means traveling a lengthy road. This road is called strategy, and each step we take along it is called tactics...

"The greatest of errors would be to transform a tactic into a strategy, just as it would be wrong to deny coming and going, flexibility at any given moment, and intransigence when that is appropriate Tactics and strategy are united dialectically. But—and this we must stress--tactics are the servant of strategy." (Page 10)

Borge affirms that the present government and institutions of the U.S.A. must be overthrown before this new paradise can be created. His term for the political and economic structure of the U.S.A. is Imperialism. He states:

"To the extent that we overcome crime, and above all to the extent that we negate the existence of imperialism we will at the same time be negating the need for the Ministry of the Interior." (Page 9)

WHY DO INTELLIGENT EDUCATED PEOPLE AID COMMUNISM

A very important and perplexing question is raised in an article by Gerald Hoffman in the current edition of the Catholic publication, PRO ECCLESIA. He writes:

"At the recent Mindszenty Conference in St. Cloud, one of the speakers was Dr. Alexander Bolanos, a native Nicaraguan who was forced to leave his country after the 1979 revolution.

"During the question and answer period, I asked Dr. Bolanos: 'Why do intelligent, educated people, with access to the truth, and who can surely see the result of Communist oppression, so often give aid and comfort to the Communists and condemn their own country, the United States, for helping those who fight against that oppression?'...

"The problem underlying that question has long perplexed and frustrated me. I have asked it of innumerable people,

including, by mail, some very knowledgeable individuals with a great deal of experience and information. I have received many answers, but they all are rather tentative, and leave the enigma unsolved."

ANTI-COMMUNISM SEMINARS IN MEXICO PARAGUAY AND ARGENTINA

Since my last report, anti-communism seminars have been held in Mexico, Paraguay, and Argentina.

Mexico

On April 16 and 17 we met with 200 Protestant pastors in the border city of Mexicali, Mexico. Their response was typical--a blend of astonishment and enthusiasm, tinged with indignation.

Their astonishment was due to the revelations of communist doctrines, morality, strategy, and objectives. The picture of communism, which they had formerly possessed, had been so different. Their enthusiasm was displayed at the close of the seminar when they proclaimed: "Let's get going on our educational program. What are we waiting for? The communist threat is very real." Their indignation was due to their awareness that they had been deceived. The information which they had previously received about communism had consisted of half-truths and outright falsehoods.

We have been swamped with invitations to conduct seminars in other areas of Mexico. We have also received numerous pleas for thousands of copies of anti-communism literature so that it can be given to the members of the congregations of the pastors who attended.

Paraguay

Paraguay is a land-locked republic located in the center of South America. It is approximately the size of Kansas and Nebraska combined, and it has a population of more than 3 million. It is bordered by Bolivia and Brazil on the north, by Brazil on the east, and by Argentina on the south and west. Its capital city is Asuncion which has a population in excess of 400,000. Forty-five percent of the population of Paraguay is under 30 years of age. Shortly after Fidel Castro came to power in Cuba, he sent 500 terrorists into Paraguay in an attempt to conquer the country, but they were unsuccessful.

Our Crusade team had been invited to Paraguay by a group of concerned citizens who have formed "The Anti-Communism Action Group". When we arrived in Asuncion on April 29, we were met at the airport by officers of this group along with members of the press, television, and radio. A news conference was our first order of business.

Since Paraguay is basically a Catholic country, the plan was to conduct two parallel programs --one for Protestant church leaders and another for the general Catholic public. These programs complemented each other; and with the help of the radio, television and press, we were able to speak to the whole nation. Seven seminars were held, and some of these were televised and broadcast nationwide by T.V. and radio. The newspapers often carried the text of the lectures.

Asuncion

Our first seminar was for Protestant church leaders from the vicinity of Asuncion. We met in the conference room of the hotel which was packed with 200 pastors. Some Protestant pastors had doubts about the wisdom of cooperating with the seminar since they did not want to get involved in politics. After reading accounts in the newspapers and receiving favorable reports from many who had attended, some of these formed an organizing committee and asked if the seminars could be repeated.

The organizers of the seminar were most hospitable, but they did not believe in allowing their guests much free time. During the lunch break, we attended the May Day festivities sponsored by the Coca Cola Company for their workers.

More than a thousand workers and their families celebrated. After a hectic lunch, we rushed back to the hotel to continue the pastors' conference.

On the second day, we began with a news conference and then conducted a seminar in the auditorium of the Ministry of Education. Accommodations were inadequate as all the seats were occupied. Many were standing while others could not gain admission. The crowd was composed of teachers, professors, professionals, army officers, government legislators, the governor of the state, the Minister of Education, students, and the news media. After the seminar, the Minister of Education told me that he wanted to use our material in the schools. Diplomas were presented to teachers who attended.

I thought the crowd would diminish on the following day, but I was wrong. Once again the auditorium was packed with standing room only. Eight hundred people were inside the auditorium with a crowd on the outside.

This seminar ended at 7:30 p.m., but our day did not. We rushed to a nearby city called Fernando De La Mora where we spoke to a capacity crowd of 600 in the municipal movie theater. Half the crowd appeared to be students, but many dignitaries were present including the Minister of Justice and Labor, and the Mayor of the city.

Encarnacion

Time for sleep was short as we did not get to bed until about 1:00 a.m., and we had to be on the road by 6:00 a.m. the next morning. Seventeen of us, including the Crusade team and members of the Committee, traveled for five or six hours in a small motor coach to the city of Encarnacion. This city had been chosen as a location for seminars because it is just across the Parana River from Argentina. The committee felt that the people in this area are being influenced in favor of liberation theology and communism by radio and T.V. programs which originate across the river in Argentina.

The seminar was conducted in a school. Once again the facilities were packed with people and the response was enthusiastic.

The second day of the seminar was a Sunday. One of the Catholic churches convened in the school so we had to wait until the 7:30 a.m. mass was concluded before we could commence the seminar. There was a beautiful spirit of cooperation. The priest and the people remained for the seminar, and the school was packed with about 700 people, including the Governor, Mayor, Catholic officers, civic leaders and students.

Stroessner City

Our next seminar was held in Stroessner City. This is a modern commercial center which was built about 25 years ago in what was formerly impenetrable jungle. It is just across the Parana River from Brazil.

The seminar was held in the Palace of Congress, and over 1400 were inside, while over 300 stood outside. I was told that this was the first time that foreigners had spoken in this building. We estimated that 40 percent of the audience were students and many of the participants were professors, teachers, and city officials. This conference was televised nationwide.

Following these seminars, we held two one-day conferences for leaders of the Protestant churches in Encarnacion and Stroessner City.

Wonders of the World

Before we left for Argentina, we took time to go and see two of the wonders of the world--a natural wonder and a man-made wonder. The natural wonder consisted of the Falls of Iguassu which have attracted tourists for centuries. They are spectacular and far surpass Niagara Falls in grandeur.

The second wonder is an engineering miracle being built on the border between Paraguay and Brazil. It is the Itaipu Dam on the Parana River, and it is one of the largest public works projects in history. The dam soars sixty stories high. The dam wall is five miles long. Its immense turbines will soon be generating electric power that will almost

double that produced by the Grand Coulee Dam which is the largest concrete dam and the greatest source of hydroelectric power in the U.S.A. When completed, Itaipu will generate six times the energy of Egypt's Aswan Dam.

Argentina

We had accepted an invitation to Argentina to appear before the Protestant church leaders of Buenos Aires and to have a strategy: meeting with a committee which had been organized by a surgeon, Dr. Enrique Tuma. Approximately 60 denominations and church groups were represented at the seminar. Many had come from a considerable distance and some, who did not approve, had attended to investigate. One of these was a superintendent of a major denomination. After hearing the message, he was convinced that it was important that all pastors should hear what we had to say. He invited us to speak at the national convention of his denomination which convenes in September.

Following the seminar, we met with Dr. Enrique Tuma and his committee to plan for a series of seminars in Argentina in September. Dr. Tuma teaches part time at the University of Argentina, the same university where Che Guevara was recruited to communism. He asked the Crusade for 500,000 copies of "Why I Am Against Communism" for the students of Argentina. He told me that the students literally climbed over one another to get one of the copies of the literature which we had previously sent. He and the committee emphasized that it was "muy importante" (very important) to have a million copies of this pamphlet published in Argentina right away. Since our financial resources are limited, I suggested that we publish in Increments of 100,000.

The Crusade family is growing by leaps and bounds. So is the expense of nourishing our new children with literature, tapes, tape-recorders, films, transportation, and food. This is why we need continuing and growing support for our Truth Fund.

MILITARY MIGHT IN NICARAGUA

The Soviet Union continues to supply the Sandinista forces in Nicaragua with modern, sophisticated arms. The prestigious British magazine, THE ECONOMIST, reports:

"They (the Sandinistas) obtained Soviet Katyusha multiple missile launchers, 152mm guns, PT-76 light tanks, shoulder-launched Sam-7 missiles and Mi-8 and Mi-24 helicopters. The latter is described by the American Defence Department as one of the best counter-insurgency helicopters in the world. 'Irregular warfare battalions' made up of young conscripts who live in the field and operate like the guerrillas were trained and sent to the border area. The Sandinistas then turned this area into a free-fire zone by moving 50,000 peasants out of it." (Page 45)

Contrast this with the plight of the patriotic forces, misnamed the Contras. They are short of ammunition. THE ECONOMIST reports:

"Early this year, the Contras began to run short of ammunition, as the congressional ban on American aid, imposed last year, began to take effect. By the beginning of April, most of the Contras had withdrawn to Honduras." (Page 45)

The Character of the "Contras

The Sandinista propagandists and their communist allies in the U.S.A. and elsewhere have been very successful in their attempts to classify the "Contras" as mercenaries, recruited and trained by the C.I.A., consisting mostly of those who previously fought for Somoza.

This is completely false. The "Contras" represent a cross-section of the Nicaraguan people who are united by hostility to the dictatorship established by the Sandinista Commandantes. An article in the May 20 edition of the liberal magazine, THE NEW REPUBLIC, by the Mexican writer, Gabriel Zaid, emphasizes this. He quotes a politically active Nicaraguan as saying:

" 'We don't want a country where there's no free press, where the leaders travel surrounded by bodyguards with machine guns, where power is abused. We don't want a country where young people don't dare go to the movies, because they're afraid of being abducted for military service.' The Sandinistas, this person went on, 'see enemies under everyone's bed, and they respond to all situations with the mentalities of the military or the police. They have assumed

the right to control anyone who does anything else, behaving frequently in a very arbitrary manner. There's arrogance and abuse of all classes. It's hard to classify this as revolutionary conduct, and the people are very much aware of it." (Page 15)

This statement was made by one who could not conceivably be called right wing. He is Domingo Sanchez Salgado, the Presidential candidate of the Nicaraguan Socialist Party.

The Soviet Union is supplying modern weapons to the totalitarian tyrants in Nicaragua. Is the United States deserting the forces of democracy in that land, which is so vital to the security of this country? If so, the policy is not merely illadvised, it is suicidal.
